# Gatwick Flights See Ripple Effect After Major Fire Shuts Down Heathrow – Friday, March 21 Update



Page 1: Introduction – Heathrow Fire Disrupts UK Air Travel

A serious fire incident at <u>London Heathrow Airport</u> has triggered widespread flight disruptions across the UK, with Gatwick Airport now feeling the impact. As Heathrow remains partially closed, passengers scheduled to fly in or out of Gatwick on Friday, March 21 are advised to expect delays, cancellations, and operational changes. Remaining flexible and informed will help minimise stress.

### Page 7: Gatwick's Emergency Support Measures

Gatwick Airport has stepped up operations in response to the surge in diverted traffic:

- Additional staff deployed to manage passenger flow and assist at check-in areas
- Increased signage and announcements to guide passengers through changes
- Liaison teams working with airlines to manage rebooking and luggage logistics

These efforts aim to ensure safety, order, and support during this unusual surge in demand.

# Page 8: Tips for Rebooking or Claiming Compensation

If your flight has been delayed or cancelled due to the Heathrow fire impact:

- Contact your airline immediately for rebooking options or refunds
