If a general roofer attempts to quickly bolt your dish back onto a different section of the roof, they are highly unlikely to find the exact coordinates required by the broadcasting satellite in space. Your television screen will inevitably display a blank signal error message, or you will experience a heavily pixelated picture that drops out every time a mild rain shower occurs. Furthermore, if the old coaxial cables are roughly pulled out of the way and left dangling over the gutters for a week during the building works, the internal copper wiring can suffer severe weather damage. Attempting to push a modern high-definition television signal through these battered, water-damaged wires simply will not provide the picture quality you expect.

Coordinating the safe removal and precise re-installation of this sensitive equipment requires specialised technical intervention. Booking a qualified engineer for professional [Sky Tv Repairs](#) and dish relocation is the only way to protect your home entertainment
